Navigator Grantee and CDO Applications

Great news! The Navigator Grantee application is now live. The deadline for submission is August 15, 2025, at 11:59 pm. While preparing to complete your application, you should have the Project and Budget Narratives saved in PDF or Word (5 pages max.), and the Budget Form saved in PDF or Excel. Upload a support letter from each one of your subrecipients, as applicable. Make sure you upload the correct documents, application can be edited but documents can't be removed after submission. Georgia Access encourages each organization to apply soon, applications will be reviewed on a first come first serve basis.

The CDO Application is also live! Organizations will have until September 12, 2025, at 11:59 pm to submit applications. You can find both applications and webinar presentations on our website at georgiaaccess.gov.

Navigator and CAC Certification and Licensure Requirements

To participate in Georgia Access for Open Enrollment (OE) 2026, individual Navigators and CACs are required to complete the Georgia Access certification training and obtain a Navigator License or Georgia Access Specialist License, respectively. The Georgia Access PY 2026 certification training went live today! you can find it at certification.georgiaaccess.gov. If you are currently a Navigator or CAC, make sure to use the same log in information from last year and the system will assign you the returning user course and assessment. If you create a new account, you will need to take the training as a new user which can take longer to complete. Licensure can be renewed at any time. However, we recommend waiting for your organization's application to be approved before starting the renewal process.

Medicaid Denial vs Medicaid Termination

Medicaid Denial is different than Medicaid Termination. Medicaid Termination is considered a QLE that opens an SEP for the consumer while denial does not. Denial of Medicaid for procedural terminations like missing paperwork, requested closure, etc. are not considered QLEs. Loss of Medicaid coverage due to a change in income, age or household may be a QLE. Consumer may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period. For more information visit the Georgia Access website.
